Henrik Hvid Jensen has a unique combination of knowledge with the digitization of global trade, leading understanding of blockchains real possibilities and limitations, and practical experience in designing and realizing digital platforms and blockchain solutions for global trade ecosystems and government organizations. Henrik is the innovator and designer of the Maersk/IBM Blockchain initiative to digitalize global trade. He has designed Blockshipping's blockchain platform for container sharing, and has been investigating blockchains feasibility for national Trade Single Windows as well as international Trade Single Windows-interoperability. He is currently advising World Economic Forum's initiative on "Inclusive Deployment of Blockchain for Supply Chains" and is the lead author of WEF's reommendations for realizing a shared digital Global Trade Identy (GTID) for business and governments involved in global trade
